

ATTO NOTORIO

Australian citizens who wish to get married in Italy, need to obtain a NULLA OSTA (official permit) which has to be presented to the Italian City Council where the wedding is taking place, before the marriage. In order to obtain the above NULLA OSTA it is necessary to prepare an ATTO NOTORIO, which is to be signed by the Australian Citizen who is getting married along with four (4) witnesses, and in which it is declared that there are no impediments to the marriage, pursuant to articles 95, 86, 89 and 97 of the Italian Civil Code.

The Atto Notorio can be obtained:

- In Australia: at the Consulate competent for the State of residence (this Consulate competent for those residing in SA)
- In Italy: at any Tribunal.

Once obtained, the atto notorio will have to be presented to the Australian diplomatic/consular authorities in Italy (Australian Embassy in Rome), which will grant the NULLA OSTA, pursuant to article 116 of the Italian Civil Code.

HOW TO OBTAIN AN ATTO NOTORIO

In order to obtain the atto notorio at the of Italy in Adelaide, the applicants must book an appointment through the online booking system di [prenotazione online](#) - and provide, at least two weeks prior the appointment, all the required information and personal details listed in the attachment (Form 1A).

Please notice that:

- The applicants and the 4 witnesses must be all present on the day of the appointment.
- The 4 witnesses must not be related to bride and groom but they can be related between them.
- If both bride and groom are Australian citizens, they can use the same witnesses and will need to sign an atto notorio each.
- The cost of the Atto Notorio can be paid cash only in Australia dollars on the day of the appointment.

Australian Citizens who wish to get married in Italy need:

1. **Birth certificate in original and related official translation into Italian**, both bearing the Apostille issued by the "Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade";
2. **Single Status Certificate** (issued by the Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages) and **related official translation into Italian**, both bearing the Apostille, granted by DFAT.

IMPORTANT: The Atto Notorio has a validity of 6 months, so it cannot be requested before 6 months from the date of the wedding.
